## SHOW HIS LOVE

## **2 CORINTHIANS 3:16 - 4:18**

3:<sup>16</sup> But whenever someone turns to the Lord, the veil is taken away. <sup>17</sup> For the Lord is the Spirit, & wherever the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. <sup>18</sup> So all of us who have had that veil removed can see & reflect the glory of the Lord. And the Lord—who is the Spirit—makes us more & more like him as we are changed into his glorious image.

4 Therefore, since God in his mercy has given us this new way, we never give up. <sup>2</sup> We reject all shameful deeds & underhanded methods. We don't try to trick anyone or distort the word of God. We tell the truth before God, & all who are honest know this. <sup>3</sup> If the Good News we preach is hidden behind a veil, it is hidden only from people who are perishing. <sup>4</sup> Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News. They don't understand this message about the glory of Christ, who is the exact likeness of God.

<sup>5</sup> You see, we don't go around preaching about ourselves. We preach that Jesus Christ is Lord, & we ourselves are your servants for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup> For God, who said, "Let there be light in the darkness," has made this light shine in our hearts so we could know the glory of God that is seen in the face of Jesus Christ. <sup>7</sup> We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves.

<sup>8</sup> We are pressed on every side by troubles, but we are not crushed. We are perplexed, but not driven to despair. <sup>9</sup> We are hunted down, but never abandoned by God. We get knocked down, but we are not destroyed. <sup>10</sup> Through suffering, our bodies continue to share in the death of Jesus so that the life of Jesus may also be seen in our bodies. <sup>11</sup> Yes, we live under constant danger of death because we serve Jesus, so that the life of Jesus will be evident in our dying bodies. <sup>12</sup> So we live in the face of death, but this has resulted in eternal life for you.

<sup>13</sup> But we continue to preach because we have the same kind of faith the psalmist had when he said, "I believed in God, so I spoke." <sup>14</sup> We know that God, who raised the Lord Jesus, will also raise us with Jesus & present us to himself together with you. <sup>15</sup> All of this is for your benefit. As God's grace reaches more & more people, there will be great thanksgiving, & God will receive more and more glory. <sup>16</sup> That is why we never give up. Though our bodies are dying, our spirits are being renewed every day. <sup>17</sup> For our present troubles are small & won't last very long. Yet they produce for us a glory that vastly outweighs them & will last forever! <sup>18</sup> So we don't look at the troubles we can see now; rather, we fix our gaze on things that cannot be seen. For the things we see now will soon be gone, but the things we cannot see will last forever.

### **Group Bible Study/Discussion:**

1. 2 Corinthians 3:16 - 4:18. What questions immediately come to mind for you?
2. How do questionable ethics & ministry practices hurt the work of Christ? What is Paul's alternative in verse 4:2b? What is the critical element for Paul? When we live according to the light of God's Word, what happens? Describe that process from your experience.
3. Since the gods of this world deliberately "blind" those around us who are not yet followers of Jesus, what is required of us in sharing the gospel with them? (Read 2 Cor 10:3-5 & Eph 6:11-17 to help with your answer)
4. Discuss a time in your life when you felt God's power carrying you through a difficult situation. How are you currently being tempted to "give up/lose heart"? Who is praying for you in this?
5. What hope do all who believe in Jesus Christ have? What should this hope motivate us to do in response? According to verse 15, why did Paul share the gospel with the Corinthians? What did he expect the Corinthians to do as well? Read Romans 1:16. Why should we preach the gospel no matter the cost? What makes it a unique message?
6. Talk about your willingness (or unwillingness) to sacrifice for (be exceedingly generous to) others. How can you grow to be more like Paul in this way? What will give you the strength to do so?
7. Paul says that his ultimate purpose for ministering to the Corinthians is to bring more glory to God as God's grace reaches more & more people (vs 15). How does the glory of God impact the way you live? How does that grace reach more people through you?
8. Do you ever find 4:16-17 difficult to trust as true some days? Why? Read Isaiah 65:17-25 & Revelation 21:3-4. How does this picture of God's final victory shape your view not only of the future, but of the issues you face today?
9. Read 4:17 again. How is it possible to grow spiritually in the midst of momentary troubles? How would you explain to a non-believer that the troubles of this world are "small & won't last very long" when compared to eternity? What examples from your own life would you use to explain the importance of keeping an eternal perspective?
10. What are the things that are "seen" & the things that are "not seen" (vs 18)? What difference does Paul describe between the two? How can we "look at" things that are "not seen"?
11. Paul's guidance helps us "hold loosely" to the things in our lives that are not going to be with us in eternity & "hold tightly" to only those things that are eternal. How can you practice that discipline with respect to generosity & use that as an opportunity to share Christ's generous sacrifice with someone this week?
