

TALK

1. Gather in the name of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit. Share your highs/lows. Read Luke 5:27-32. What strikes you as you read?
2. What's the minimum standard requirement for following (being a disciple or an apprentice) to Jesus? What does that suggest about his call on your life?
3. What does the "guest list" at Levi's dinner party with Jesus tell you about his life? What does that say about the people in your life who are not-yet apprentices to Jesus & their circles of relationships? What does that mean about trying to share Christ's love in such a way that they are able to be drawn to him by the Spirit?
4. We know Jesus didn't spend time with sinners because he approved of sin. What illustration does he use to explain why he kept sinners in his fellowship circle? How does that reveal his mission? How is Jesus a physician? How does he heal both physically & spiritually? What implications does this have for our ministry as a church BUT ESPECIALLY YOUR ministry in your every day living?
5. Read Rom 12:9-21. Paul encourages the church to be an open inclusive loving community. How are his commands a contrast to our culture & a witness to Christ?
