

TALK

1. Gather in the name of the Father, Son & Holy Spirit. Share your highs/lows. Read John 9:31-36 & 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. What strikes you as you read these texts?
2. Define "disciple." What is Jesus' expectation of his disciples? What the 3 things does Jesus say will be the result from holding to his teaching (8:31-32)?
3. What does it mean to be "free"? In what sense does truth make us free? Does freedom mean we may do as we please? (see 1 Peter 2:16 & Galatians 5:13 to help guide your answers) See also Titus 2:11-12 & Galatians 5:19-21. How is saying "no" to a heartfelt desire an act of freedom in Christ?
4. In 1 Cor 15:2, what does it mean to "continue to believe the message (word) I told you"? Why do you think Paul gives such an exhaustive list of those who saw the risen Jesus? What does that tell you about the verifiable nature of the gospel?
5. 1 Cor 15:10 is Paul's testimony to the cross' power to change lives. How does living marked by Christ's cross work to change you over the course of your life?
6. How is sin like a life of slavery? How is life as a son as different from life as a slave? How are you using that "Sonship" to introduce others to freedom in Jesus?
