GROWINHIS GRACE

BIBLE READING: Galatians 2:16-21

¹⁶ We know that a person is made right with God by faith in Jesus Christ, not by obeying the law. And we have believed in Christ Jesus, so that we might be made right with God because of our faith in Christ, not because we have obeyed the law. For no one will ever be made right with God by obeying the law."

¹⁷ But suppose we seek to be made right with God through faith in Christ & then we are found guilty because we have abandoned the law. Would that mean Christ has led us into sin? Absolutely not! ¹⁸ Rather, I am a sinner if I rebuild the old system of law I already tore down. ¹⁹ For when I tried to keep the law, it condemned me. So I died to the law—I stopped trying to meet all its requirements—so that I might live for God. ²⁰ My old self has been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me. So I live in this earthly body by trusting in the Son of God, who loved me & gave himself for me. ²¹ I do not treat the grace of God as meaningless. For if keeping the law could make us right with God, then there was no need for Christ to die.

Group Bible Study/Discussion:

- 1. Read Galatians 2:16-21. What strikes you in this part of Paul's letter? What questions come to mind? How might this have sounded to the first recipients of this letter?
- 2. Three times in this section of his letter, Paul asserts we are not justified (made right with God) by observing the law, but by our faith in Christ. How is it possible to be justified if we haven't done anything to earn it?
- 3. If keeping the law can't save me, what is it for? Why does Paul say that if I expend myself trying to live by/keep the law I demonstrate that Jesus died for nothing or there was no need for him to die?
- 4. What does "dying to the law" mean in 2:19? What is the significance of having been crucified with Christ? How does that happen in a disciple's life? What does it mean to God? What does it mean to you? What effect should this have on your daily life?
- 5. What is the problem with legalism? What makes it different from the gospel?
- 6. How are Christians to approach the Old Testament, and particularly things like the 10 Commandments? Are they still applicable now that we are forgiven in Christ? What happens if we simply ignore all that the Old Testament offers to us?
- 7. What does it mean to be crucified with Christ? What kind of life are we to live if we no longer live, but Christ lives in us? How can you live this transformed life in Christ this coming week? Where will you be over the next seven days? Pray that God makes his resurrected life visible in your words & deeds.
- 8. If Christ's death & resurrection are the "true north & axis" for your life, what does that look like in daily living? How do you talk about that way of living around those who do not share your faith in Christ?
- 9. Read Romans 6:2-6. The assumption throughout the New Testament letters is that being buried & raised with Jesus by baptism & faith will produce a life in you that imitates the life of Jesus Christ. What do you think Paul would offer to you as a gentle corrective or even a stern rebuke about how "Christ in you" appears to the outside world?
- 10. Are there times when you feel insecure in your relationship with God? What might lead someone to feel that way? If those times come, how do you reconnect with the Father in a way that you could share with someone else?
